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MiniMe Mindfulness

This week, the children all took part in a MiniMe Mindfulness session in school. We have been taking part in these sessions every half term to support the children's wellbeing and help them become happy and confident learners. The sessions explore how we can control our thoughts and actions to determine success and happiness.

The focus for this half-term's session was gratitude.

During the sessions, the children thought about all the different things that they were grateful for. They talked about if something happens in your day, it is not a bad day, it is just a bad moment in your day. There is always something that we have to be grateful for. The children practised saying what they were grateful for in their lives using the sentence starter 'I am grateful for...'

Some of the children said they were grateful for food, their families, friends, home, animals and education.
